

### Program -

**Dave Saunders** introduced our speaker, **Daphne Swanson**, President of Junior Achievement of Central Virginia.

Ms. Swanson told us that Richmond Junior Achievement began fifty years ago as an after school program for high school students with the goals of teaching financial literacy, work readiness, and entrepreneurship.



They now operate K-12 programs that include job shadowing, the JA Company program, Finance park, and JA In A Day. They have a financial literacy program for tenth graders in all of the regional school systems that cover such financial needs as loan applications, down payments, day care costs, the average cost of a new car, eating out costs, as well as costs for clothing, pets, and unexpected "that's life" costs. Ms. Swanson told us of volunteer opportunities for our members as well as their capital campaign for their new "Finance Park" at the Libbie Mill library in Henrico County. She also urged us to consider support of JA with our Rotary Grant requests.
